

Other Items to Note

Clery Act Crime Awareness Report — The report includes statistics for the previous three years concerning reported crimes that occurred on campus, in certain off-campus buildings or property owned or controlled by Humboldt State University and on public property within or immediately adjacent to and accessible from campus. The report also includes institutional policies concerning campus security, such as policies regarding alcohol and drug use, crime prevention, the reporting of crimes, sexual assault and other matters.

For about 50 cents a day, you will receive protection in the case your property is stolen or damaged. The university has no insurance to cover the loss or damage of personal property of Licensee. Therefore, the University highly recommends that you obtain insurance, such as a renter's policy. The University assumes no responsibility for personal items stored in University storage areas. New Student Room Assignment Priority— Priority for new students is determined by the date in which your completed application and \$200 nonrefundable application fee are submitted. Therefore, the sooner we receive your application and application fee, the better the chances you will be assigned to your preferred living area. It is important that you complete the application process as soon as possible if you wish to maximize your priority opportunity. Should a wait list be necessary, we offer priority status to new freshman students.

Returning Resident Room Assignment Priority— Each spring, current residents have the opportunity to request to return to the residence halls for the next academic year. In order to be eligible to return to the residence halls, you must have your current year residence hall room & board fees paid in full, have a positive student conduct record and have completed your online application and pay the \$200 nonrefundable application fee by the required deadline listed in the "Living Here Next Year" brochure. Space in housing is limited! 600 spaces will be allocated for returning residents and Housing student staff. You must complete the online application and pay the \$200 nonrefundable application fee by the required deadline. We will then randomly assign lottery numbers to each person that qualifies and will allow 600 (including Housing student staff) to select a room for the next academic year during the online room selection process. Residents who return their applications after the deadline or receive lottery numbers greater than 600 will be placed on a wait list to be assigned rooms in August, if space is available. If we have a wait list, priority will be given to new students before we begin to place returning students on the wait list into rooms.
